Dear Friends,

Along with my work as your interim pastor, I have been meeting with high school friends this winter and early spring to plan our 50th high school reunion in late July. I cannot believe that 50 years have passed so quickly! I cannot believe how much older all my childhood friends now are!

Our lives have been a series of dramatic changes. It is easy to remember when our homes got air conditioning and color television (1963), our country landed a man on the moon (1969), telephones became portable, then cellular, and computers became the center of our work lives (I typed my way through college as an English major, writing essays on a manual typewriter). Can you buy a new car today without a computer already installed in it?

Change has come, and keeps coming, to our Church, too. The COVID epidemic forced us all to offer live streaming of services. Adult Sunday School classes are taught with the help of videos from famous authors. Meetings happen with ZOOM and votes are sometimes taken by email. These are only some of the changes we all experience in our churches, and our personal lives.

When we come to our worship services in May, there will be some constants amid change. Our youth will lead worship on May 7 with an emphasis on staying connected through changing times. Our Mother's Day service on May 14 will remind us of one of the classic women heroes of the Bible. Our recognition of graduates on May 21 will emphasize the continuing value of education. Our May 28, we celebrate Pentecost (Pentecost is the third great Christian holiday, after Christmas and Easter.) There is also Memorial Day weekend, when we recall the sacrifices of so many to provide us the freedoms we enjoy today.

All of the changes, even the turbulence of our world, from Ukraine to Sudan to Taiwan to our nation's borders, make us rely even more on God's promises. For this beautiful month of May, I hope we will remember and often cite the words in Hebrews 13:8, where the Bible says, "Jesus Christ the same yesterday, today and forever." Always remember Jesus Christ, and his guidance over our lives and our Church, as He always remembers you!

Music Ministry Corner

So grateful for another month working here at FPC. Next month I will officially begin working as DCE in addition to my duties as Choir Director & Organist. I am excited about this position and pray that I can do it justice. I know what a wonderful job Mac did for so many years and thank him for the foundation he set so that I can continue this journey. I have already begun some DCE work with marketing & publicity. I will not be leading the youth as I will have a full load already in the fall. There just aren't enough hours in the day for me. I do not take pride in being busy, but rather, I'm just doing what the Lord has called me to do. God never said His work would be easy, but if we seek & trust Him first (Matt 6:33) it'll work together for good (Rom 8:28). I plan to give the sermon on Pentecost Sunday, May 28, on the fruits of the spirit from Gal. 5:22. How do we know we are on the right path? How do we know we are following God's will for our lives? These questions will be addressed in my sermon. The month of May also features Youth & Children's Sunday 5/7 and Graduation Sunday 5/21, both of which will feature special, worshipful music.

Now, I would like to share the back story of one of the anthems the children will be singing, "Dem Bones," on 5/7. When I first began my position here in February, Libby Pierce came to me and asked me if I would consider having her brother, John, play the trombone sometime during worship. I immediately recalled a previous jazz arrangement for children that I composed about 10 years ago for "Dem Bones" which features the trombone. I had never notated the piece, only improvised it. So when I rehearsed with John—who enthusiastically agreed to play, by the way—for the first time, things did not go well. You see, John cannot communicate with people via speech. John at one time was a prolific musician and talented band instructor, but in 2018, John had 3 major strokes and was left severely impaired—unable to speak or comprehend anything. It was an incredibly trying time for him and his family. They scrounged to find rehab for him but could only afford 3 months. He has improved tremendously from where he was, but still has a major communication barrier. He has not played his trombone in any public setting since before his strokes. Here's the catch—although he cannot communicate, he can still hear, play, and read music. Wild, huh?! So when he and I rehearsed the first time together, he could not decipher what I wanted him to do without a score and he couldn't comprehend what I was trying to tell him. It left us both frustrated, but we did not give up. I texted him to give me one week and I would write out his part. It took me about 4 days solid to notate his part on Finale, a music composition software, with the lyrics. I was ready for our second rehearsal but was incredibly nervous. This was a make or break moment. "Lord, please help this to work," I fervently prayed for days leading up to the second rehearsal. I wanted John to be able to play his trombone part with the piano correctly and I know John did, too. Right before I set the score before him, Libby and I texted each other with prayers. I set his music on the stand, took a deep breath, and gestured a one measure count. He came in with the piano and played the entire piece flawlessly.

When we finished, although we couldn't speak to one another, we looked at each other and cried. It worked. Again. And again. And again with the children singing with us the next week too. Wow! Talk about the power and healing agent of music! What a swift reminder that God is AWESOME and can use anyone in ANY circumstance for His glory. Come on Sunday, May 7th to hear the children sing with John playing his trombone. You will be blessed.
